- Wind Ensemble has received performance time for ISU Concert Band Festival- April $28^{\text {th }}$ at 3:30 PM

## VP Ways \& Means Update: Deanna Reeves

- Pizza Party for Symphonic Band will be on February $9^{\text {th }}$
- Bundt cakes will be sold at Heineman Music Concert this Saturday, February $11^{\text {th }}$.
- Winner of Lou Malnati's fundraiser will be "pieing" Mr. Krivosik on February $14^{\text {th }}$
- People want fundraising for Disney trip. Some ideas:
- Coffee \& Cookie Sales- An option and they seem to be able to offer what they had in the past
- Tom's Farm Market- Not taking any new groups this year. However, could sell Tom's gift cards. Band would get $\$ 5$ for every $\$ 25$ card sold.
- Deanna suggested doing a poll to see if people were interested in the Coffee \& Cookie sales or Tom's gift cards.
- Car Wash- If someone would like to run this over the summer
- The next fundraiser will be with orchestra and choir since they are going on this trip as well.
- Next Band Fundraiser will be Culvers in April


## Committee Updates:

- Website- Nadia Hurmi spoke on Craig Hurmi's behalf and said she told him it needed to be done by February $14^{\text {th }}$.
- Sponsorship Program- Carrie McCabe
- Initially planned for roll-out on February $1^{\text {st }}$ but will be pushed back to the end of this week to be rolled out to families.
- Sponsorship push will run the month of March so that names/logos can be secured for advertising on the back of Marching Band Kick Off Shirts.
- Sponsorships can be directed to something specific, be a general donation, or can be providing band meals.
- Music Café- Carrie McCabe
- \$5,420.24 Net Total for the event
- Only $20 \%$ of students participated in selling tickets
- 160 tickets were sold; 37 of those were on-line sales
- 3 businesses donated food: Chick-Fil-A, Niko's Tavern, Blessed Little Kitchen
- Money from booster account was used to cover expenses up front, but with donations later given no additional booster money was used to cover expenses for this event.
- 22 raffle baskets ranging from $\$ 60-\$ 550$. Most were in the $\$ 150-\$ 200$ range
- $35 \%$ of students donated money towards the raffle baskets. Number could be slightly higher due to some inconsistency with how money was collected and recorded.
- Most popular baskets: Family Movie Night, Charcuterie Board, Pool Pass, Cubs tickets, HHS Parking Pass and Spirit wear
- Least popular: Rockford Ice Hogs, Kane County Cougars, Schaumburg Boomers
- Carrie and Deanna will be meeting soon to debrief the event
- Scholarship Program- (Given by Tiffany Thakkar) Josh Smith is heading up the Scholarship Committee and everything has been sent to him.
- Tentative Dates: Roll Out opportunity to apply by end of February with application deadline of March $30^{\text {th }}$. This would allow for 1 month to score applications.
- Prior forms were locked so needing some time to update and make accessible.
- Need 2-4 more parent volunteers.
- Clarified that Color Guard can apply for a scholarship
- Scholarships will only be eligible if mailed in and post marked March 30. No applications will be accepted if hand delivered in all effort to make this process as consistent as possible.
- Uniforms- Tiffany Thakkar
- Anne Moersfelder will be taking over.
- Uniforms will be handed out on Feb $7^{\text {th }}$ and $9^{\text {th }}$. They will be returned on the night of the concert- Feb. $14^{\text {th }}$. If this time is not convenient, they can talk to Tiffany.

Tiffany will send more specifics out but noted that in her initial conversation with the food pantry they are in need of Personal Care items. Also noted was $\$ 8.00$ of buying power for the pantry if cash donations are received.
